The Day the Life Raft Took Over

One afternoon, shortly after returning to port aboard the USS Plunger (SSN-595), an ordinary task turned into chaos. We were opening the lower hatch of the forward escape trunk, a compact space roughly six feet in diameter. Before our mission, we had stored some paint, other atmospheresensitive items, and a 20-man life raft in the trunk. It was now time to retrieve them.

As items were passed down to the crew below, the rope from the life raft accidentally fell through the hatch. Thinking it was something to catch, someone below gave it a tug. Unfortunately, the rope wasn't just a rope—it was the inflation line for the raft. Instantly, the raft exploded to life, rapidly filling the tight space and trapping the sailor inside.

The noise was deafening, and the sailor's muffled screams echoed through the compartment as the raft began expanding down into the passageway. With knives in hand, the crew scrambled to cut through the raft to relieve the pressure and free their shipmate. As they succeeded, a rush of CO2 flooded into the sub, choking the group and setting off the atmosphere monitoring alarms.

The incident, though resolved quickly, became an unforgettable reminder of how even routine tasks on a submarine can escalate into chaos. To this day, it serves as a humorous yet sobering tale of life beneath the wayes.


DAYAWAY -Field Trips for Adults Denise Chard

Cornhole leagues are complete! League play begins the week of January 6 and continues for ten weeks, including the final week of playoffs.



WELCOME TO KAYAKING 2025! We have six (6) kayaking dates currently scheduled beginning on January 25 and ending on April 19. Most of our tours are on creeks and the Intracoastal Waterway: we try to go to a different destination each time out. We use sit-on-top kayaks (these are very easy to get on and off), the water is shallow (mostly), and the kayaks are very stable (definitely!).

We generally leave the TW Clubhouse around 1:00 p.m. to carpool to the launch site. We get on the water by 2:00 and back to landfall by 4:00, often with dinner to follow for those who want to get a bite to eat together (no obligation). Although no experience is required, we do provide a free Safety and Instruction class for those who have not kayaked before and for anyone who just wants to try out kayaking or to practice kayaking strokes.
